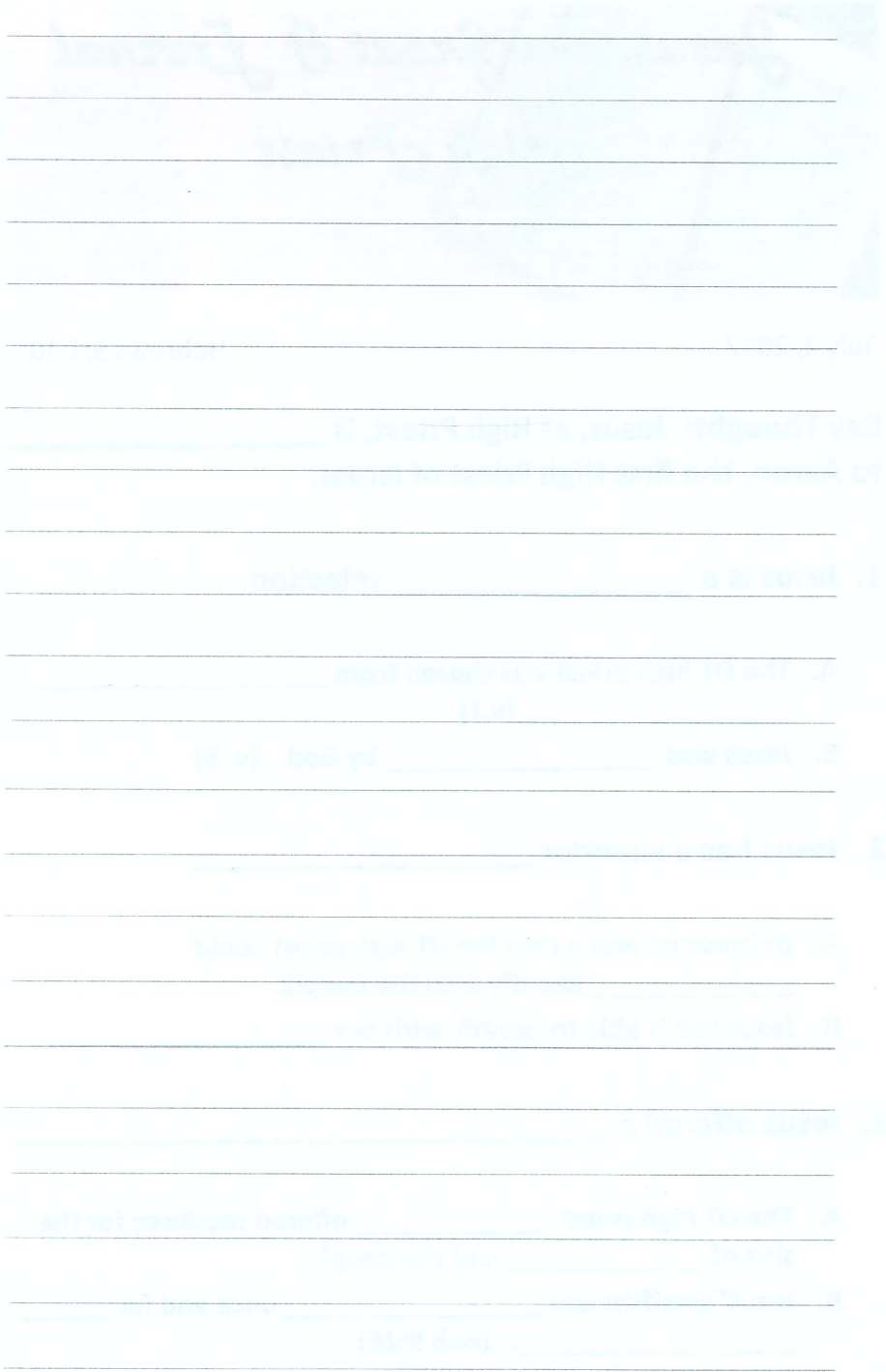

Use the below questions to aid you in making personal application of your study in the Word.

2. What was the major role of the Old Testament High Priest? See Leviticus 16:14-16.
3. According to Hebrews 5:1-3 why is the Old Testament high priest able to sympathize with the weakness of the people?
4. How would you define the meaning of "to sympathize"? What must be true in order for you to sympathize with another person?

5. How can Christ's sympathy or identification with us be superior to that of Aaron or another high priest? If Christ never succumbed to sin then how can he sympathize with us who have given in to temptation? (Hebrews 5:7-9)
6. How could you apply the first three beatitudes of the sermon on the mount to the ability to sympathize with others? See Matthew 5:3-5.
7. How do the first ten verses of Hebrews 5 add to your understanding of Hebrews 4:14-15. How might it add to your confidence to approach Christ?
8. When we have sinned and are in trouble, or are dealing with the temptation to sin, we often hesitate to turn to God. We either think we can handle it on our own, or we feel the need to "clean up our act" before we approach Him. How can Christ's understanding and sympathetic nature motivate you to turn to Him today in times of temptation and trouble?
