<u>Title</u>: Connected To One Another

Texts: Romans 12:1-7; Ephesians 4:11-16, 22-25

This is my commandment, that you **LOVE ONE ANOTHER** as I have loved you (John 15:12)

Live in **HARMONY** with one another (Romans 12:16)

Be **KIND** to one another, tenderhearted, **FORGIVING** one another, as God in Christ forgave you (Ephesians 4:32)

**SUBMIT** to one another out of reverence for Christ (Ephesians 4:21)

Therefore **ENCOURAGE** one another and **BUILD** one another **UP**, just as you are doing (1 Thessalonians 5:11)

Therefore, **CONFESS YOUR SINS** to one another and **PRAY** for one another, that you may be healed

Show **HOSPITALITY** to one another without grumbling (1 Peter 1:9)

READ through John 14-17 and list as many descriptions about the relationship between God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit as you can find?

Read John 17:5 and 17:24 What do we learn about the nature of God BEFORE the world existed?
